

A GESTURE OF GRATITUDE TO THE PROFESSIONALS AT THE CHPG

During the COVID-19 epidemic, the Stelios Philanthropic Foundation wanted to express its support and gratitude to the professionals at the Princess Grace Hospital.

In 2020, it donated 2,000 gift vouchers, each worth €50, to healthcare professionals on the lowest incomes, in recognition of their exceptional commitment during the health crisis.

During the festive season of 2021, the Foundation repeated this generous gesture by offering 2,000 gift vouchers worth €25.

OPHTALMOLOGY

• Purchase of a cycloplegic agent: Effectively treats glaucoma by safely and effectively reducing intraocular pressure and offering tailored solutions to a wide range of patients.




This equipment is used to treat one patient every month.

ULTRASOUND SCAN

• Purchase of an ultrasound scanner with elastography: A painless and rapid ultrasound technique that measures tissue stiffness to diagnose and monitor conditions such as liver fibrosis, inflammation, or cholestasis.





Normal Cirrhosis

Examples of 2D-SWE elastograms showing a normal liver (left) and the gradual progression from left to right towards cirrhosis. This progression is reflected in a gradual increase in stiffness values (in kPa) and a shift from blue to red.

UROLOGICAL SURGERY

• Funding for HIFU procedures (2-day session Focal One): Treats localised prostate cancer by destroying cancer cells in a targeted manner, without affecting neighbouring healthy tissues.



10 medical interventions each year.

• Funding for robotic surgery procedures: Improves the precision and efficiency of minimally invasive surgical procedures, while reducing complications and promoting faster patient recovery.



A total of 152 robotic urological procedures were performed in 2024.

ORTHOPAEDIC SURGERY

• Purchase of innovative custom-made prostheses: A fully personalised solution that preserves the cruciate ligaments for more natural knee movement, while offering predictable surgery thanks to patient data and simplifying logistics.



A total of 52 custom-made prostheses have been purchased since 2016.

CARDIOLOGY

• Funding for the upgrade of the CARTO 3 system: Optimises the efficiency and accuracy of ablation treatments for atrial fibrillation and other cardiac arrhythmias.



In 2024, this equipment was used to treat 33 patients.

RAINIER III CENTER

• Funding for a connected apartment: An innovative, modular show-apartment equipped with appropriate technologies, designed to assess, train and support elderly people who are losing their independence, as well as their carers and healthcare providers, in order to promote safety and enable them to continue living at home.



The launch is planned for September 2025.
